This would be a good instructional book for beginners who want to learn how to make Barbie clothing. The Barbie patterns include: Swimsuit, Tennis Outfit, Lounging Pajamas, *English Riding Suit, *Pants Suit, *Halter Top, and *Everyday Dress, Evening Gown, and Fur Coat (*Barbie clothes show finished project in color, however black and white photos are shown for all pieces in the directions section). The Ken patterns include (with color photo of finished result): Swimsuit, pajamas, Sporty Outfit, Dress Shirt, Tie, Plaid Slacks.As you are sewing these, you should tailor the fit to your own doll - the garments in the photos look somewhat "rough" and need some refinement. By that i mean contouring the side seams, selecting appropriate fabric for the garment, cutting Ken's shirt collars to scale, etc. The quality of the garments are not as

refined as what you would find in a commercial pattern such as from Simplicity or McCall's. However, as mentioned above, these would be good for beginners starting out.
