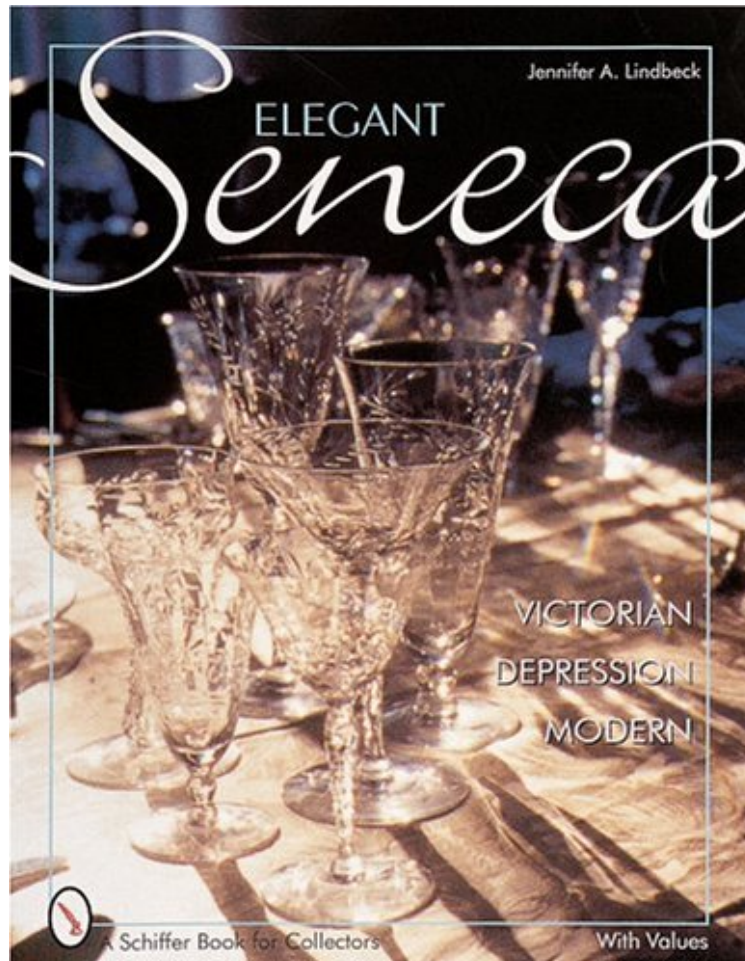

The cover is eye-catching, and the photography inside is lovely. I spent a large portion of my youth within sight of the Seneca plant in Morgantown. With a little more work, the author could have produced an even better book. My grandfather has a brief mention in the book. He spent 44 years of his life devoted to the glass factory. As the manager of the cutting department, much of the glass was from his designs. The author references a magazine article from 1984 in which my grandfather's work was featured. He drew the designs which created the many patterns developed by the Seneca Glass Company. The State of West

Virginia Science and Cultural Center is in possession of the 15 pieces of his crystal donated prior to my grandfather's death in 1994. Had the author taken the time to do a bit more research, she would have been able to see the one of a kind pieces, plus a sketchbook of his original designs. This beautifully illustrated book showcases Seneca glasswares produced during the Victorian era, Depression years, and contemporary times in over 750 superior color photos. It gathers an amazing assortment of stem, bar, and tableware; rare, early, unusually large, and colored pieces; unbelievable place settings, and much more. Original company catalog pages and advertisements (vital for pattern identification), information on company history and years of production, a look at the techniques and necessary tools in glass making, a tour of the Seneca factory museum display, a price guide, and an index make this book the first to document the company's entire production range.
