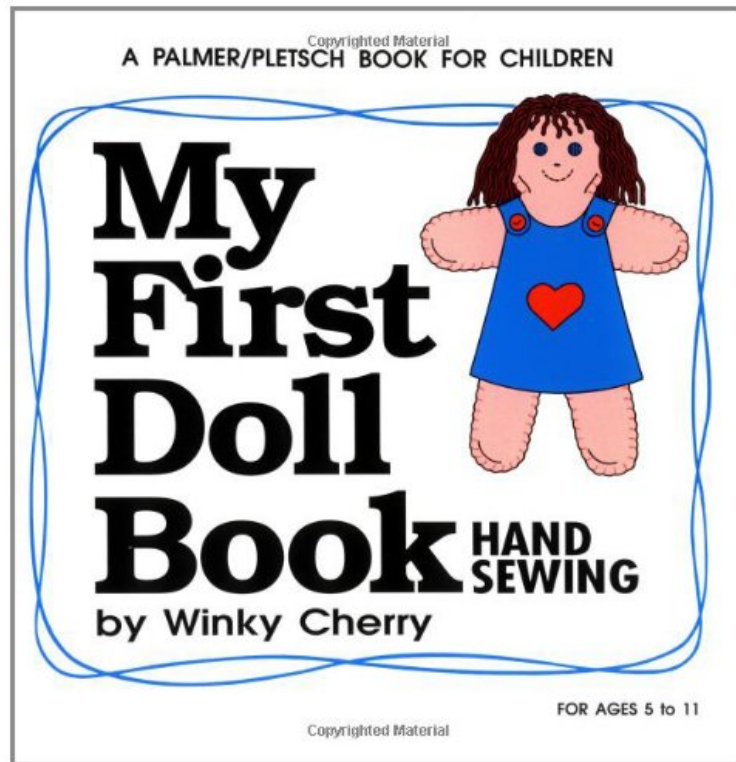

If you and/or your daughter are new to sewing, I would recommend purchasing something more basic with pre-made holes before tackling this project. When we did finally finish, my daughter was very happy with the doll we made. She is very proud of it and shows it off to everyone. The project is one that most young sewers would like to do, and it teaches wonderful basic

concepts that will carry over to any type of sewing in the future. The projects and the illustrations and photos give the young sewer confidence. The only thing that my young student had trouble with was attaching the yarn hair. It was really hard to pull the needle with the yarn through the felt, so I would recommend that an adult help with this part of the doll-making process. Overall, I love the book.

Rhymed, easy-to-follow instructions describe how to sew a felt doll with an embroidered face, yarn hair, and hand-stitched clothes.
