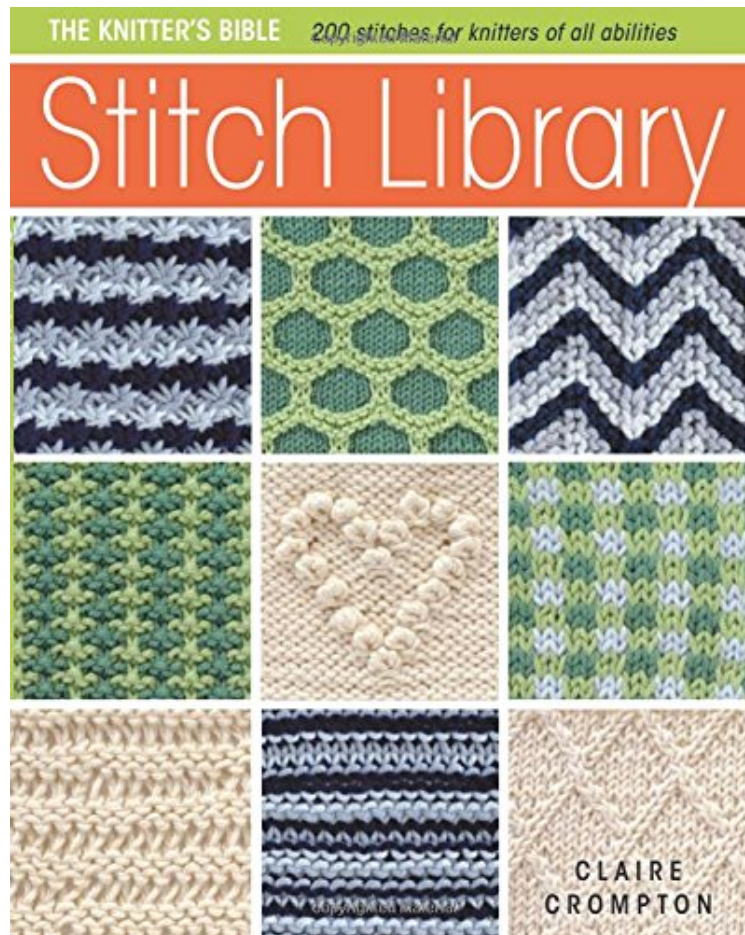

It, of course, has the usual How to knit, purl, cast-on, cast-off, decrease, increase and all that. What I like about it is that it teaches you a few tricks and then sets you up with a little project that fits the new knitting tricks you just learned. It is set up in sections that are beautifully illustrated and well written with equally beautiful photographs. Such as 1) Getting Started - Which includes all that I described above plus Needles Equipment, Introducing Yarns Choosing Yarns, Ribs, Gauge (tension), Knit Perfect and Abbreviations 2) Creative Options - Intro, Lace Knitting, Fair Isle, Cables, Embossed Knitting, Short Rows, Twisted Stitches, Intarsia and Circular Knitting 3) Exploring Choices - Intro, Medallion Knitting, Beaded Knitting, Looped Knitting, Entrelac, Mitred Squares, Fulling, Smocking, Tassels, Lace and Fringe, and Correcting Mistakes PLUS MUCH More 4) Stitch Library - This section (why I ordered the book after I checked it out from the library) offers many lovely stitch patterns, plus edgings 5) Projects - Scarves, Bags, Cable

Throw, Toys, Usual pot holders although with a bit of style and much more. The photos of the projects make it easier to figure out what is going on with the pattern and the illustration for the stitches will be good for all types of knitters (beginners to advanced)It's size is 8.5" by 11" and I like that because the photographs and illustrations are large enough (for us old ladies) to be able to see each individual stitch. I loved the book so much that I wanted my own copy of it. I was very happy when I saw it on for less than the retail price of it. The book arrived within that week. It came in perfect condition, nothing was bent or scratched.It's a beautiful book with lots of beautiful photographed pictures. I didn't know how to knit, and this book taught me how to - so I was a bit surprised when some of the reviewers who seem like they already know how to knit stated that it wasn't very informative or that the directions were hard or complicated... I mean, I didn't know how to knit before this book, so hard could it possibly be? The cover is made of heavy-duty, hard cardstock. The pages are glossy photo paper quality. The book is big, I would say it's about the size of a Better Homes Garden magazine (which is a bit bigger than standard magazines). There are a lot of different styles and cute projects. I especially love the one with the heart designs. I made that design on a scarf and a handbag for a friend. I also tried the house design on a hanger, and it came out absolutely beautiful. For those more skilled, there are tons of novel stitch patterns.Definitely buy this.
