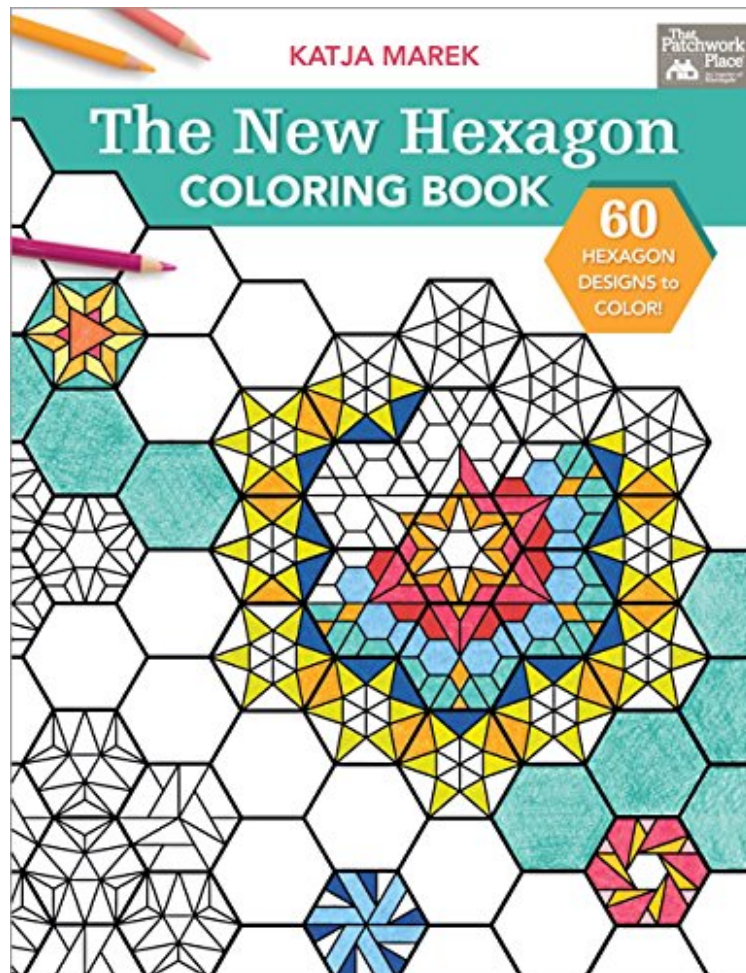

Winning the award for art achievement in high school convinced her that she wanted to pursue a career with a creative outlet.
