I should have taken the contents to be exactly what the title says, illustrations and pictures of 2800 padlocks. I am a lock collector who has been searching for any type of reference book that would help me establish a timeline for my padlocks. The prices are vastly outdated to the point they didn't need to print them, and the pictures are page after page of pictures followed by a list of titles like "Yale Towne Mfg. Co.". That's as far as the book went. When I look at my locks I can see they have "Yale Towne Mfg. Co." on the front. The book has nothing to add. No patent dates, no years of production, no models, no links between manufacturers, no transitions to different technologies, no useful information at all. I have 70+ Yale Towne locks and the book had pictures of about three of them. After finding them I still know as little as before. I paid well over \$50.00 for the same thing I could get by going to "Google Images". They have the same amount of information. Actually, Google Images have some links to actual information. The book has absolutely nothing. I feel like a complete idiot for buying the second best (?) book available. Jack Smith has one that is almost impossible to find and if you do find it, it will cost you almost \$300.00. Not practical. I wonder how Arnall got all those pictures and prices

and managed to not know a single thing about the locks, or just avoided putting it in his book. A total rip-off. Don't make the mistake I did and get impressed by the number of lock pictures. I could have bought a crate of coloring books and gained the same knowledge I got from this book. Save your money and search the internet for libraries.
