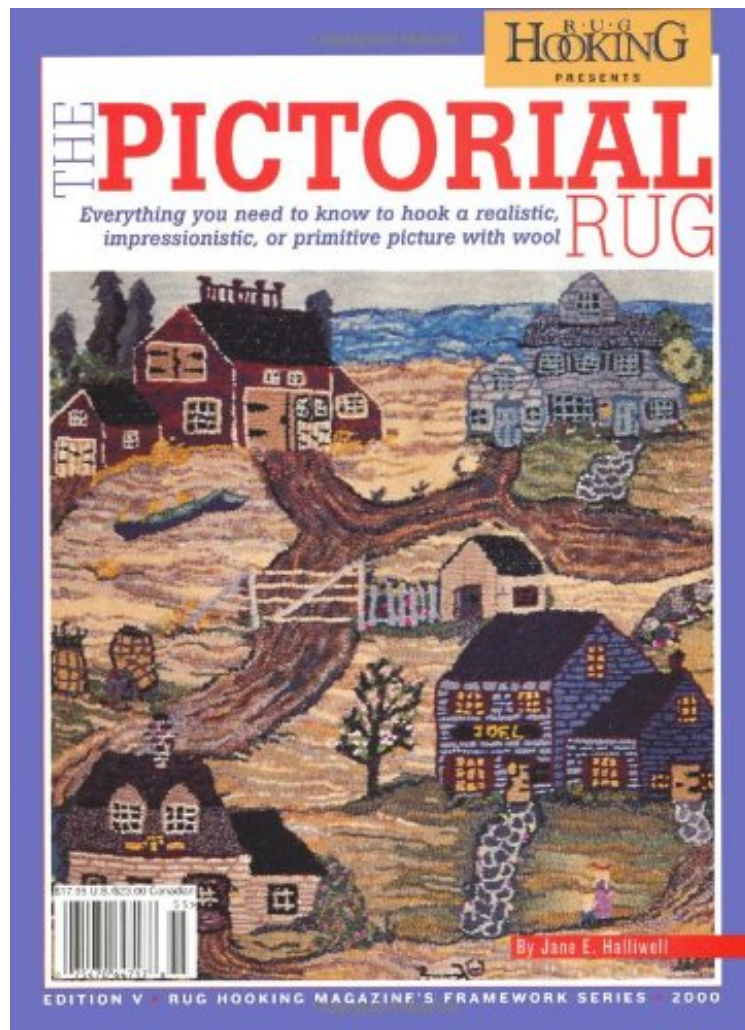

of rugs. The second thing was how small they were, and how small the print was for my aging eyes. No doubt the publisher was attempting to reduce costs, as there are quite a number of color pictures for a 56-page book. Other than the printing, this book has tons of practical help for hooking various elements in pictorials (clouds, trees, rocks, buildings, water) and includes dye formulas for wool to use in them. Jane is quite renowned for her wool colors, so to have a source of dye recipes that she uses is wonderful. It may also be the reason that this book is apparently scarce on the used book market; this is the first time I've seen it for sale. Jane (now known as Jane Halliwell Green) gives lots of help with what dyes to use for specific elements and what elements of the pattern to hook first.
