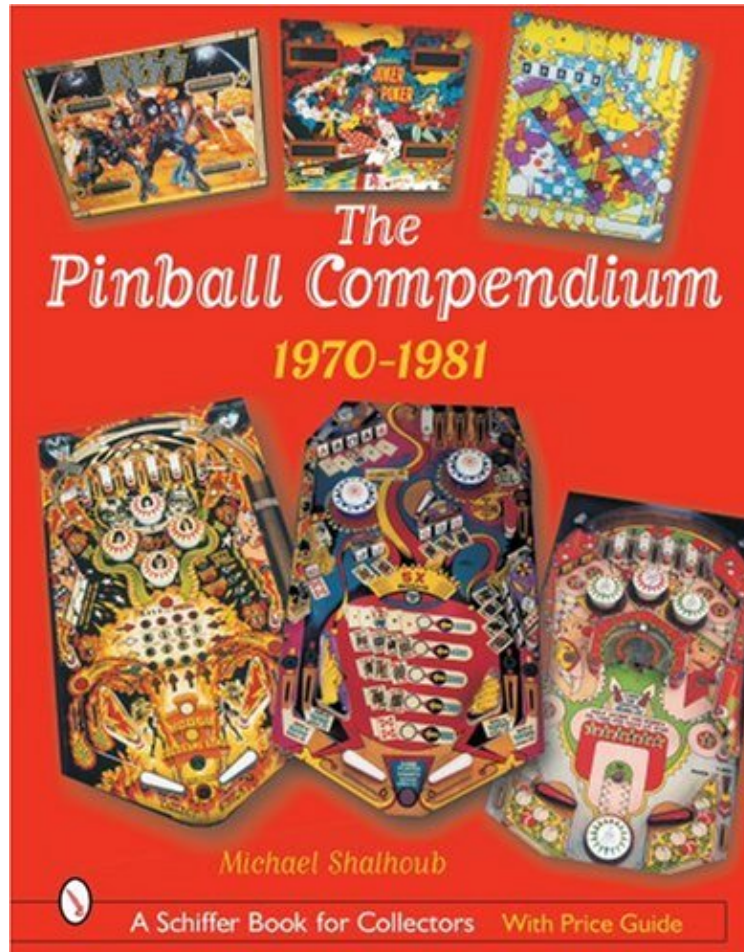

Possibly, difficult one to do as previous book had most of the classic games and style. The 70's were more about refining these games and adding new and clever rulesets/gameplays. Trying to come up with something gimmicky to attract a player over their competitor (as Bally turned out to do to become the leader by the late 70's). Excellent in detailing the transition from electro/mechanical to solid state games and offers comparisons. One poor aspect is lack of detail on quite a number of foreign manufacturers. This was a period when countries outside USA took a foothold in the market and showed a fresh approach.
