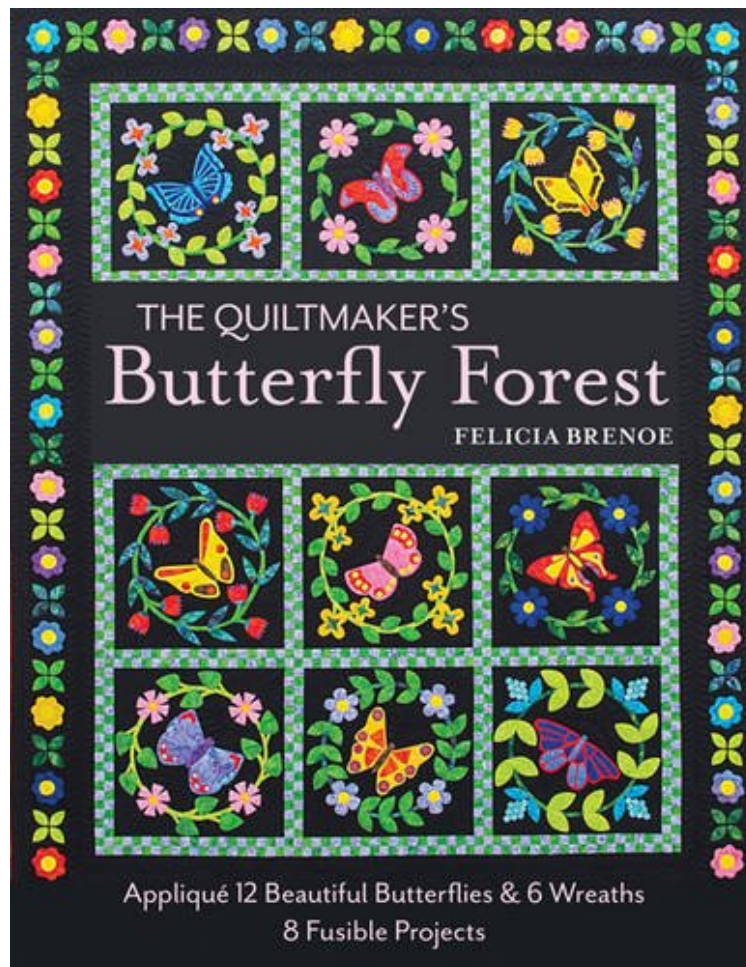

All the applique is created with raw-edge, machine blanket stitches. The instructions are easy to follow and basic so they can be applied to any machine applique project you can dream up. This book includes thorough technique descriptions for machine applique newbies (like me) and seasoned sewists

looking to try something new. The images use various fabrics ranging from batiks and Japanese imports to modern print quilting cottons. It helps to see the projects created with different styles so readers can see how these quilts and projects will look in their style fabric, regardless of how they quilt. This book may just have given me the confidence to try machine applique myself, though I'll probably start with the placemats first and leave the whole quilts for when I am better practiced! Sew 8 whimsical projects that capture nature's beauty, beginning with the magnificent 12-block sampler of butterflies and wreaths an ideal block-of-the-month quilt. Introduce contrast, embellishment, and negative space as you sew other large quilts, pillows, wallhangings, and placemats. Full-size applique patterns are included, plus an easy guide to raw-edge fusible applique.

Fuse and stitch butterfly patterns inspired by The Quiltmaker's Butterfly Forest author Felicia T. Brenoe's travels to the Ecuadorean rain forest. Designs feature 12 butterfly species and six wreaths in eight projects that represent a range of styles. (Quilts and More, Spring 2017) A sojourn in the Tiputini Biodiversity Research Station deep in the heart of the rainforest left biologist Felicia Brenoe in awe of the beauty and complexity of the plants and animals around her. She was especially captivated by the variety of butterflies and chose to celebrate them in the masterpiece applique quilt shown on the front cover of her book. All the instructions and patterns to make it are included in the book and the pull-out pattern sheets. In addition, Felicia has developed seven other projects using variations of the butterfly shapes. They include a cushion, placemats, wallhangings, and several other bed quilts. She also provides instructions for raw-edge applique by machine, the applique method she used for her projects.
